Certified Nurse Aide is 120-hour training program designed to provide the basic training for a nurse aide to function in a nursing home or health care facility, improve the quality of care, encourage career development, and provide necessary skills for job opportunities in a health care facility.

The conceptual framework of the Nurse Aide Training Program is centered on state regulations mandated by the Tennessee Department of Health and Environment. Graduates of this program are prepared to take the state exam to become a Certified Nurse Aide.

Working under general supervision, the Certified Nurse Aide is responsible for the physical care of residents of a routine nature in a nursing home or extended care facility. Duties and responsibilities include: providing assigned residents with routine daily nursing care, such as bathing, dressing, hair, nail and oral care, eating, and assisting to and from bed in accordance with current regulations, established nursing care procedures, and as may be directed by nursing supervisors; providing quality patient care, such as safeguarding resident belongings, assisting with activities of daily living, and respecting resident privacy and confidentiality; performing restorative and rehabilitate nursing tasks, such as turning and range of motion exercises, as ordered; documenting all duties performed on appropriate records and flow sheets; and keeping resident rooms orderly.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

No high school diploma or equivalent is required. Must be at least 17 years of age. Prior to admission, physical examination, results of TB Skin Test, proof of Hepatitis B immunity, and urine drug screen are required.
